Our lawyer Michelle Donato again has assisted us in some legal matters over the past year. We had one of our trustees resign recently, Tony Procia. The Board would again like to thank him for a job well done. He and his wife Colleen recently sold their home. Tony and Colleen were both very active in this community. I would like to welcome our new Board member Steve Mangeri, who will now be in charge of Security and the Marina. Steve had shown an

- 6. Treasurer's Report: Jean Johnson "We are healthy since Sandy, without any assessments". Jean handed out several sheets which are attached and explained the entries. We have collected 98% of dues. The number of Guest Badge sales is up, and over the budgeted amount. \$20,000.00 was transferred to the Operating Account from the Play Ground Account. The Marina did well. The Life Guard Fund, which consists of monies earned by the Life Guard Events and sales, supports the purchase of special equipment required for tournaments is a separate account. Reserves are healthy and will be redistributed. Most of the billing activity is the end of May. The picnic income is only an estimate at this point as all bills are not in. We received \$7,105 in donations. A motion to accept Income and Expense portion of the budget report was made by Mattson of 230 Gull Lane, seconded by Beverly Sorber, 107 W. Shell Way, approved by majority vote. A review of the Balance Sheets was discussed and a motion to approve was made by Pete Patner, 121 W. Chadwick, seconded by Roger Burns of 22 So. Lagoon, approved by majority vote
- 7. Michael Barrett, Beach Supervisor reported that we have 6 new guards starting this summer and lost only one since last year. The net at the Bay Beach was installed by the Guards, Memorial Day weekend. It is convenient for many members and is staffed every day. A winter fund raiser letter, which is done every other year showed a great testament of support for the guards. Michael said, "He is looking forward to another great year. A. Special Events: Eileen Barron

- **B. Badges: Eileen Baron** We purchased the member badges from Jersey Diagnostics, a developmental disabilities group, at a good saving ¼ the previous price. They are a great group to work with. Renter's badges will be entirely different with a different color stripe for each week. They are available before and after this meeting. Opening day is next weekend; badges will be available at regular clubhouse hours. It hurts the club if you LEAVE BADGES FOR YOUR TENANTS. PLEASE DON'T!!!!!!. We have young badge checkers, they may be your names and might be easily intimidated by people they know. Please have your badges showing. Any difficulty call Eileen.
- **C. Beach: Charlotte -** Eating on the beaches, remain to be a problem. It is still prohibitive, if you see a violator report it to the Roamer or Michael.
- **D. By-Laws: Port- Thank** you for attending. Port told everyone he broke his neck last year and it is a slow recovery. He is finally getting around independently. Changes in By Laws are the responsibility of each chair person to come up with the necessary wording for the changes and then present it to the board. The changes in Improvements will be published after the anticipated changes come through from FEMA.
- **E. Clubhouse: Port Porter-** The appearance speaks for itself. We are doing rentals now at \$225, and liability insurance coverage. A letter from the insurance company confirming this coverage is required. This can be retained as a rider on your home owner's policy if your insurance company allows this, or a separate policy purchased.
- **F. Grounds & Maintenance: John Sorber** Thank you for your support. In making way around the neighborhood, it was noticed that many homes are without house numbers. Numbers are required by emergency services. Broken furniture, junk and weeds are seen and phone complaints have been received. Letters will be going out. The By Laws state that property must be maintained, that goes for properties under construction. You are the owner, you are responsible for what your contractor and his employees do, Alan May said, Construction equipment has to be staged. Infractions may be reported to Toms River. Alan will give telephone number. This also pertains to road conditions and pot holes.

G. Improvements: Kirk Miick- The substantial damage determination is reaching its 4th anniversary in October. This is the cutoff for funding. Nothing has been announced yet as to the consequence for not completing within in that time. The last 2 years we have allowed unlimited construction during the summer. This year it is more regulated. No new construction will begin, no pile driving, ground tempering, and cutting to be done inside. Follow Toms River rules concerning hours and days allowed, i.e., no construction on Sundays. Jack Impomeni questioned the hours construction is allowed. Kirk answered 8:00AM – 4:00PM. Jack said, "The builders need to be spoken to, they are starting at 7:15AM and waking people. Kirk said, hours are 8-4, weekdays, 8-2 Saturdays, and no Sundays. Tom asked if there is a rule requiring port johns at construction sites. The answer was No. A member stated, "Thank You to Alan & Kirk, for the many meeting they have held. They have put in long

hours; we have the best information coming through than any community.

Insurance: Jeff- A little problem was encountered in the renewal of the workman's compensation. We were put into assigned risk as we did not meet the profile as only part-time employment. We had a slip and fall in the clubhouse. They asked for a lot of money, we settled. Insurance Companies do not like to insure on the barrier islands. EVERYTHING IS CURRENTLY UP TO DATE.

- **I. Marina: Steve Mangeri Thank** you for your confidence in me, I will do my best. We will be cleaning up the parking areas for the Marina, bushes trimmed, numbers replaced. Water turned on. Only 3 slips left and we are now open for jet skis. Pilings appear to be intact this year.
- **J. Security: Steve-** Thank you to Joe Kobylarz for setting up. The Security telephone number is 732-252-7475. Refrigerator magnets are available in the office. Be mindful of your neighbors, this is tight quarters and please don't encroach upon their space. There will be limited traffic safety officers this year, OBII will only have 2. One located on 35South at Harbor Drive, and the other on 35 N at E. SeaWay. They will be here this weekend training. Jack Impomeni said. "This is a disaster waiting to happen" We need to call TR.
